

## Materials List For; Design Principals for Every Quilt Style.

workshop with Kathy McNeil

- Traditional Quilt blocks or patterns that you want to work with.
- Pictures that have inspired a quilt design, but you don't know where to start.
- Quilts or quilt tops you are willing to share with the class, while we learn together how to strengthen our designs.

For Contemporary designs bring several pieces of paper the actual size of your quilt, or in the case of a very large quilt options include; scaling it down by  $\frac{1}{4}$  to  $\frac{1}{2}$  of that actual quilt.

For Pictorial quilts, take your photos to your local copy shop and have them enlarge them to the size you would like to use for a pattern. Minimum 18 inches. Black and white copy ok.

(Details are much easier to capture the larger the scale).

Beginners will have best results choosing photos that have simple, large to medium shapes with sharp details. Photos of objects shot up close, or far away work best!

- Graphing or sketch paper large enough to lay out your quilt design.
- For traditional quilts bring graphing paper so that you can layout the pattern, later to be enlarged.
- Tracing Paper
- Pencils, colored Pencils, eraser
- Rulers, squares circles or diamond templates that you may need.
